## Verbs: Past and Present

More verbs today Class 2! Today we are going to be looking at past and present tense verbs. Sometimes we are a little unsure of verb endings and irregular past tense verbs, so we will practice today.

## Spelling Rules:

- $\sqrt{If}$  a word ends in a consonant like (t), we add an (-ed) ending.
- √ If a word ends in a vowel (e), we add just a (-d) ending.
- $\sqrt{If}$  a word ends in a (y), you need to take the (y) off and add (ied).
- $\sqrt{\mbox{ Be careful, some words ending in a consonant, will need you to double the last consonant.}$
