




Class 2 - Miss Strachan

Acomb Flood Alleviation Scheme Community Update

January 2020

The Environment Agency and Northumberland County Council are working together to reduce flood risk in Acomb. This newsletter provides you with an update on our work.



Acomb Flood Alleviation Scheme (FAS)

We are continuing to progress our work to develop and deliver a scheme in Acomb that will reduce flood risk.

We've looked at a range of options and a preferred way forward has been developed that consists of a combination of traditional engineering within Acomb and natural flood management in the upper catchment. This option would reduce flood risk to 41 properties in Acomb.

The preferred option is to construct a small earth embankment and flood wall to keep river flows within the water channel at the debris screens at Morrison Terrace; improved road drainage to manage surface water; and the use of natural flood management features upstream, including in-channel leaky barriers, woody debris and floodplain reconnection in order to reduce the overall flow in the Red Burn through Acomb.

We have received formal approval from our national project assurance board to deliver this scheme. Detailed design of the solution is currently underway and construction of the in-town work is expected to start in February 2020.

We are working with the Tyne Rivers Trust on the development of the natural flood management features and we've engaged with a number of local landowners and land managers where the features may be installed. Construction of the NFM features will continue into 2021.

Engagement with Action4Acomb about the delivery of the scheme is also ongoing.

We have also agreed and secured a financial contribution from Highways England from their Environment Designated Fund which has helped to fill a funding shortfall.

Maintenance

The Red Burn is a main river and the Environment Agency has powers to carry out maintenance to help reduce flood risk. Current maintenance work includes regular clearance of the trash screens, including clearance during high flows when necessary. We also deliver weed control in the water channel, the removal of Japanese Knotweed and works to maintain access to the screens.

Where appropriate, we also respond reactively to anything that may increase the risk of flooding to properties.

We have planned intermittent works for 2020 and 2021 which include small scale improvements to existing assets and a CCTV survey of the culverts.


