### **Reception - Mrs Manning**

Reception pupils have been learning about the 2d shapes - circle, square, triangle and oblong. We are looking at the features of each shape, such as how many sides and corners and we have been making our own using geostrips.

We have also looked at a variety of different jobs, thinking about what we want to be when we grow up. We did some amazing paintings to show our ideas.






#### Class 1 - Mrs Barber

Class 1 pupils have been learning all about subtraction. The children have enjoyed using practical objects and arrays to solve different subtraction problems. We have been chasing the sun in science this week. The children made their own opaque objects to investigate how shadows are made.

We have also been creating our own weather forecasts this week in geography, the children had to work as part of a team for this task.

In English, we have been thinking about what we would like to be when we grow up. The children decided to work in pairs to interview each other about what they would like to be and explained their reasons why. We then recorded these interviews on an I-Pad.
