Curriculum News; we have updated some areas of our curriculum provision in order to provide breadth, depth and high quality teaching and learning experiences for the children and have invested in some new schemes and resources across the school.

- Phonics and Spelling. The teaching of synthetic phonics is firmly established in our school and we are building upon this good practice and success by adopting the Read Write Inc phonics in Reception and Year 1 and Read Write Inc Spelling programme in years, 2,3 and 4. The spelling programme provides interactive learning opportunities which teach the children spelling rules and tools for successful independent spelling across all their work.
- Maths; Over recent months we have made maths a focus area for improvement and have invested in training for Mrs Hinchcliffe, the maths leader. We have made a successful application to the North East Maths Hub so that we can be at the forefront of developments and improvements in maths teaching. As a result of this work, our maths curriculum is now a Mastery in Maths Curriculum which means that children learn place value and the four operations in greater depth at a level appropriate for their year group before using their arithmetic and reasoning skills in other areas of maths.

We will invite you to information sessions later in the term. I would really appreciate some feedback from parents as to which times of day/evening are most convenient for people so that we can maximise attendance. You can talk to me in the yard or send a note in.

Wentworth on Wednesday;

The children all enjoyed their first swimming and multi -sport session and year 1 children have made a great start. Just a reminder that girls need a one piece costume and boys need to wear close fitting trunks not swim shorts.

The cost to parents is £5 a week which contributes towards the cost of transport, swimming session and the multisport session. I do appreciate the fantastic contributions that are made as we could not continue to provide this unique provision without the parental support. You can send in money for the half term which will be £35 or send in £5 a week.

**Attendance**; It is essential that children attend school unless they are ill. Holidays in term time cannot be authorised unless there are exceptional circumstances as defined in the Hexham partnership of schools agreement which is available on our website or from the office. Our Educational welfare officer regularly visits school to check that every child's attendance is as good as it possibly can be.
