Free School Meals



Robinwood - Year 4 Residential

We have had confirmation from Robinwood that the Year 4 Residential trip booked for April will sadly not go ahead. They are awaiting guidance from the DFE as to when they are able to re-open their centres and it is looking likely that it may not be until May or June at the earliest. We will organise a full refund for all payments made to school and are looking into options for day trips later in the summer term when restrictions allow.

Class Messages

Reception

The children in Reception have been very excited to have their friends back. They have settled straight back in and got on like the superstars they are! We have had lots of time to catch up, talk about how we're feeling and started looking at the lifecycle of a butterfly. They have really impressed me with their knowledge!

Class 1

The children in Class 1 have settled back into their school routine amazingly well. They have remembered when to wash their hands, our class routine and we have been busy talking about our class rules too. The children loved seeing all of their friends back at school on Monday morning and really enjoyed our special virtual assembly with all of our school friends too. I am so happy to see all of the children's smiley faces back in school. This week has been a busy week! In English this week, we have been reading the story of the 'Owl Babies', we have been learning about habitats in Science and we discovered that this story was set in a woodland habitat. In Maths this week we have been learning all about length, we have learnt how to use standard units of measure and non-standard units of measure to investigate the lengths of different objects in our classroom.

Just a little reminder that from Monday 8th March we are only able to change reading books once a week. Our book changing day is a Monday only. We would really appreciate it if you could please make sure that your child brings in their reading records and books on a Monday, so we can change and quarantine the books. Please remember that we are unable to change any books in a reading record that has not been signed by an adult. Please don't forget that our reading target in Class 1 is to read at least three times a week. This can be a mixture of books sent home from school and books read at home too.

I am so impressed with how well you have all settled back into school life and I am looking forward to seeing you all again next week!

Class 2

Class 2 have settled in very well, demonstrating a mature attitude and super keen to get going! I have been really impressed with their attitude towards learning. We have been working on fractions this week in Maths; the children have tackled tricky problems involving proper and improper fractions amazingly! In English the children have been writing poems and making sure that we include good rhythm and rhyme!

In addition to their normal lessons, the children have been completing independent experiments using magnets to celebrate British Science Week and are looking forward to inventing a new game using magnets.
