

The children make us so proud at Forest School. They work independently and safely and show great interest and care about the world around them. They are always busy from the moment we get there until the second we leave. There is always such a happy, focused and friendly atmosphere where they are always excited to share with their friends and the adults there what they have found, made or achieved.

We have found some incredibly interesting mini-beasts and have talked about different life cycles, including metamorphosis. We also found the remains of some dead pheasants and had great conversations about what could have killed them, predators, prey and carnivores.

It's amazing how much learning happens when they are playing in the woods! Each session was completed with a fabulous fire and they learned about fire safety by collecting wood to burn and toasting fruit loaf. We ate it with a drizzle of honey. Yum!! Mrs Gray
